

SCHOOL DESCRIPTION

Founded in 1869, Diocesan Boys' School (DBS) is an all boys' school that nurtures a strong community of lifelong learners grounded in Christian principles, who are committed to serve, to lead, and to make a difference in an ever-changing world. Located in the heart of Hong Kong, DBS students emerge as articulate, resilient, and globally aware individuals—ready to contribute meaningfully to diverse academic communities and to lead with integrity in an ever-changing world.



SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Our school curriculum is designed and structured to provide students with a holistic and liberal education for the development of the whole person. Students benefit from a well-balanced education, supported by expert faculty, and immersed in a vibrant ECA programme spanning music, sport, debate, and community engagement.

Students in Grades 7-9 follow the local Junior Secondary School Curriculum (NSS). For Grades 10-12, they choose between the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (DSE) or the IB Diploma Programme (IB). IB enrolment is capped at 60 students per grade to maintain our Direct-Subsidy School status.

Medium of instruction: Lessons in all subjects are conducted in English, with the exception of Chinese and French subjects.

Grading System and Ranking Policy: GPA is not calculated and unweighted; students are **not ranked**.

Overseas Exam Preparation: Our school is **not** a test centre for SAT/ACT/UK admissions tests/IELTS/TOEFL etc. Students take these tests on their own, as necessary.

Academic Rigor & Grading: Our school's internal examinations are intentionally designed to be more challenging than public exams, fostering academic excellence and resilience. Unlike grading systems commonly used in North America, at our school, a 'C' at our school is considered a good performance in a class of highly competitive and academically capable students. To foster a rigorous academic culture, it is the school's tradition and practice for assessments in Grades 10–11 to be set at the standard that students are expected to reach when they complete the IBDP/HKDSE syllabus at the end of Grade 12, rather than the standard they are currently at. As a result, their Grade 11 results may appear lower than their Grade 12 predicted grades (this serves as a reliable indicator of final exam performance).

CURRICULUM | ACADEMICS

DBS has a **reputation for academic excellence**, with students achieving outstanding results in both the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP). In grade 9, students complete the final year of their Hong Kong Junior Secondary School Curriculum. All subjects listed for grade 9 are compulsory, and assessment is largely based on examination. This comprehensive curriculum allows students to survey a wide range of subjects in preparation for both the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP).


HONG KONG DIPLOMA FOR SECONDARY EDUCATION (HKDSE)

Under the local Senior Secondary Curriculum, our students take the four core subjects (Chinese Language, English Language, Mathematics (Compulsory Part), Citizenship and Social Development and select two or three elective subjects among the fifteen (including French) that we offer. Most students in our HKDSE section take 6 or more subjects.

To facilitate students' whole-person development and nurture positive values, we offer a wide range of Other (non-academic) Learning Experiences (OLE) both within and outside school hours. These include moral and civic education, community service, career-related experiences, aesthetic development and physical development.

In 2024-25, one student achieved four 5** and three 5* in the HKDSE examination. Another student from our school achieved three 5** and four 5*, while one student obtained one 5** and six 5*. The following shows the achievements of our students in the last six years:

Percentage of Students Achieving 25 Points or Above in Best 5 Subjects




INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA PROGRAMME (IBDP)


Since launching the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme in 2009, the IB Section has provided a holistic curriculum that balances scholarly achievement with creativity, activity, and service, allowing for personal growth.

Under the IB curriculum, Grades 11 and 12 students take six subjects—three at Higher Level and three at Standard Level—alongside the Core components: Theory of Knowledge (TOK), the Extended Essay (EE), and Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS), which foster independent research skills, intercultural understanding, and a commitment to making a positive impact.

Academic outcomes are exceptional: in May 2025, 3 students achieved the perfect score of 45, with 7 more earning 44 points. The average score of all our Class of 2025 IBDP graduates is 41.31 while the world average was 30.58.




Proportion of DBS IB Students' Achieved Scores compared with Worldwide Scores

DBS is well-known for its academic excellence, achieving outstanding results in local and international STEAM competitions.

SPORTS

With 25 inter-school sports teams and 8 inter-house sports teams, DBS sports life is a pillar to the school's aim of all-round excellence. In the 2024-25 academic year, our sports teams have continued to work hard and have clinched **19 Overall Champions** in archery, athletics, badminton, basketball, beach volleyball, crosscountry, fencing, football, handball, hockey, indoor rowing, squash, swimming, tennis, tenpin bowling and volleyball.

We have also nurtured a number of athletes who have achieved success at the **international level**, such as **Student Youth Games** swimming title in November 2023, Gold and Silver medalist (HK record) at the **Asian Junior Athletics Championship**, and 7th place in the **World Junior Athletics Championships**. Our upcoming graduate, Timothy Chow, is the youngest member of the **Men's HK Football Team** in the semi-final of 2023 Asian Games, and the Team recently won Champion in the **Tri-Nations Tournament 2024** with Fiji and Solomon Islands.

DEBATE, MOCK TRIAL & PUBLIC SPEAKING

As a prominent public speaking school in Hong Kong, our students have reached the **World Individual Debating and Public Speaking Championship** (WIDPSC) on 18 occasions since 2018. At the **International Public Speaking Contest** (IPSC) hosted by the ESU, two students advanced to the Grand Finals in April 2022 and 2024, ranking top 6 among 1 million contestants.

Our debating team has brought home the **champion in over 10 regional and international competitions.** Most recently in 2023-24, our school team emerged victorious in the nation-wide Sing Tao Inter-School Debating Competition, earning the team's **first-ever victory in 39 years** of participation. In addition, the team also won the **Hong Kong Champion in the Oxford Schools Debating Competition 2022**, the largest British Parliamentary debating competition worldwide. TEDxDBSHK 2025 also marked the school's first TEDx event in 6 years, which featured 150+ participants and 5 high-profile speakers.

Students of our Green School Action Group (GSAG), a student-led organisation, have demonstrated exceptional success in both external competitions and internal campus initiatives:

- Ocean Park Conservation Alliance Seahorse Ranger Initiative:
 - Organised campus night walks and birdwatching sessions for the annual City
 Nature Challenge; built and installed bird boxes
- School initiatives Recycled over 50 kg of plastic per semester; raised HKD15K through self-made terrarium workshops at our school's annual Garden Fete
